Notice of Intent and Pre-Application Document – Mokelumne Pumped Storage Project (P-14796)

Dear Secretary Bose:

On December 21, 2017, the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) issued a Preliminary Permit (Permit) to GreenGenStorage, LLC (GreenGen) to explore the concept and feasibility of the proposed Mokelumne Pumped Storage Project (Project) located in parts of Amador and Calaveras Counties, in the State of California. The Project would utilize the existing Salt Springs Reservoir and either the Lower Bear Reservoir or the Upper Bear Reservoir. The Project would entail construction of a new powerhouse to accommodate a 400 megawatt (MW) Project, a new power tunnel extending from one of the two Bear Reservoirs to the powerhouse, and a tailrace that extends from the powerhouse to the existing Salt Springs Reservoir. A new transmission interconnection would be constructed to deliver energy from the Project into the electric grid at the existing Salt Springs substation.

GreenGen applied for a four-year extension to the preliminary permit on October 27, 2020 and FERC issued a four-year permit extension on February 23, 2021. FERC's order extended the length of the existing preliminary permit to a total of 84 months, thus expiring on November 30, 2024.

GreenGen has worked collaboratively with key stakeholders and Tribes in the proposed Project vicinity and has conducted significant early engagement and outreach with these groups since 2018. GreenGen has now elected to enter into further consultation with requisite state and federal agencies, Tribal entities and interested public and initiate the formal licensing process. As such, GreenGen hereby files the Notice of Intent (NOI) to file application for original license and Pre-Application Document (PAD) for the Mokelumne Pumped Storage Project. GreenGen proposes to utilize FERC's default Integrated Licensing Process (ILP) to develop a comprehensive Project license application.

Pumped storage is a commercially proven grid scale energy storage and grid stabilization technology. The Project will provide needed services to assist California in meeting its green energy and carbon reduction goals included in Senate Bill (SB) 100 and other legislation. The expanded use of existing reservoirs and transmission corridors reduces environmental impacts and allows for expanded use of the waters of the United States (WOTUS) in new and beneficial ways, including for electricity generation, water storage, and water supply for fisheries, recreation, agriculture, and municipal purposes. This Project will utilize energy produced by renewable resources during times of high production when the energy might not be needed to serve load, and then deliver the energy back into the grid at a time when load exceeds renewable energy supply. The Project will also provide necessary grid support services as older fossil fueled power generators are retired to meet SB 100 objectives and will have the ability to provide long term storage of renewable energy for periods of up to 12 hours.

NOTICE OF INTENT TO FILE APPLICATION FOR
ORIGINAL LICENSE

Pursuant to 18 C.F.R. § 5.5, GreenGenStorage, LLC (GreenGen) notifies the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) of its intention to file an Application for an Original License for the Mokelumne Pumped Storage Project, FERC Project No. P-14796.

Unequivocal Statement of Intent:

GreenGenStorage, LLC intends to file an application for an original license for the Project utilizing the Commission's default Integrated Licensing Process (ILP).

Type of Principal Project Works to be Licensed:

The Project is currently proposed in two configurations with 400 MW of power generation capacity for each configuration. The two Project configurations are based on a 2-unit installation with 8 hours of energy storage. During Project licensing, other Project capacities may be evaluated and a final Project power generation capacity and configuration will be determined based on the results of stakeholder input and studies performed as part of the FERC licensing process.

The Project configuration consists of a 2-unit layout installed within an underground cavern complex, utilizing the existing Salt Springs Reservoir and either Lower Bear Reservoir or Upper Bear Reservoir dams. The Project would include new inlet/outlet structures at both the upper reservoir and at Salt Springs Reservoir, a water conveyance system consisting of excavated, lined or un-lined tunnels, steel penstocks, and surge facilities, delivering high pressure water from the upper reservoir to the pump-turbine equipment located in an underground powerhouse. The powerhouse cavern complex will contain the pump-turbine motor-generator equipment, as well as the balance of plant electrical and mechanical equipment. The powerhouse cavern complex includes galleries for locating adjustable speed equipment, step-up transformers and conveyance shutoff/isolation equipment (spherical inlet valve on high-pressure side, and bonneted slide gate on the low-pressure side). A low pressure tailrace tunnel connects the powerhouse cavern and conveyance system to a new submerged inlet/outlet structure in Salt Springs Reservoir. Surface features include inlet/outlet gate houses in vicinity of the upper and lower terminus of the water conveyance, and surge facilities along the waterway alignment. Electrical interconnection, switchyard, transmission corridor, as well as access roads are also included.
